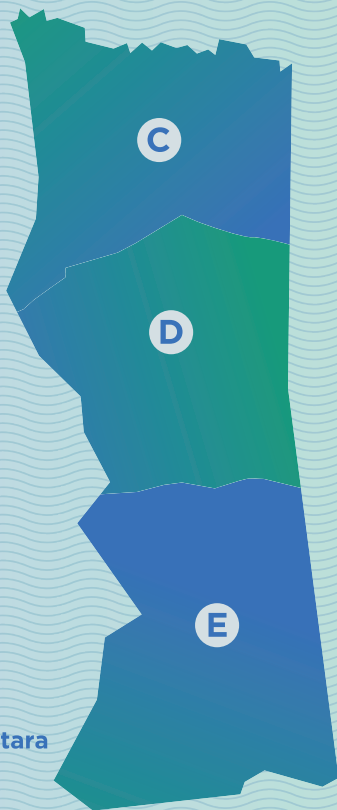
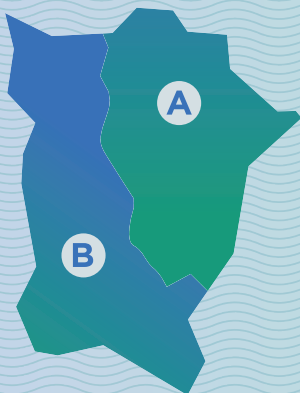


## **PENANG, Malaysia**

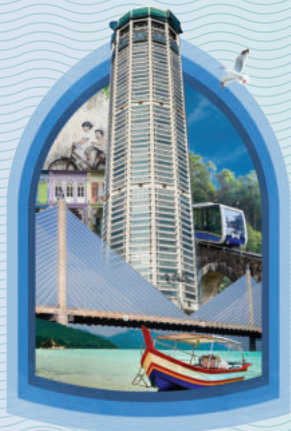

### PENANG STATE MOSQUE

The Penang State Mosque, built in the 1970s, combines Malay and Western Modernist styles. Five thousand people can find a place of worship within the mosque.

### LEBUH ACHEH MOSQUE

Lebuh Aceh Mosque (Acheen St Mosque) is a 19th-century mosque built by the Acehnese situated on Acheen Street, George Town, Penang, Malaysia.

The houses surrounding the mosque today is part of the original Muslim settlement of the mid 19th century.





## MASJID KAPITAN KELING

The Lebuah Acheh Mosque, also known as the Acheen St Mosque, was constructed in the 19th century by the Acehnese community. It is located on Acheen Street in George Town, Penang, Malaysia. The dwellings surrounding the mosque are a constituent portion of the original Muslim settlement established in the mid-19th century.

## TANJUNG BUNGAH FLOATING MOSQUE

Masjid Terapung Tanjung Bungah is located in Tanjung Bungah, which lies between George Town and Batu Ferringhi. It was constructed in 2004 as a replacement for the previous mosque, which suffered extensive damage after the tsunami.



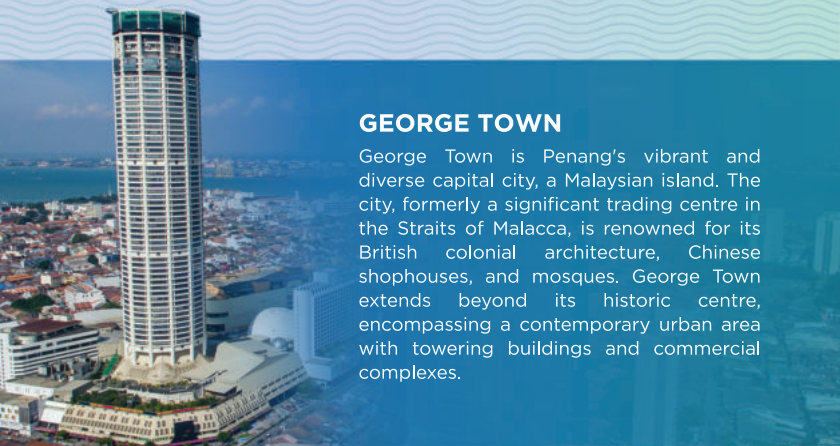
## ABDULLAH FAHIM MOSQUE

Masjid Abdullah Fahim was named in honour of the renowned scholar Allahyarham Sheikh Abdullah Fahim Sheikh Haji Abdullah. Sheikh Haji Abdullah Fahim was born in Mecca in 1870, in a location near The Grand Mosque (Masjid Al Haram) known as Shuib Ali.

## GEORGE TOWN

George Town is Penang's vibrant and diverse capital city, a Malaysian island. The city, formerly a significant trading centre in the Straits of Malacca, is renowned for its British colonial architecture, Chinese shophouses, and mosques. George Town extends beyond its historic centre, encompassing a contemporary urban area with towering buildings and commercial complexes.

## PENANG HILL

Penang Hill is home to a hill resort in Malaysia, situated on a cluster of hills close to the island's geographic centre. It is located in the suburb of Air Itam, nine kilometres west of George Town's central business district. The Malay name for Penang Hill, Bukit Bendera, literally means Flagstaff Hill.





## PULAU AMAN

Aman Island is a small island in the South Seberang Perai District of Penang, Malaysia. It is situated off the coast of Seberang Perai. Referred to as the "Island of Peace," it serves as a residence for a traditional Malay community. Notable attractions on Aman Island include Jalan Telaga Emas, Batu Perompak, and the adjacent Gedung Island.

## PENANG NATIONAL PARK

The Penang National Park is a compact forest reserve that boasts the distinction of being one of the smallest in the world. Additionally, it is the exclusive location of the sole meromictic lake found in Malaysia. Approximately 150 bird species have established their habitat in the Penang National Park. Currently, admission is complimentary, and there are numerous captivating jungle paths with different levels of difficulty and unspoiled sandy shores.



## KAMPUNG AGONG

Kampung Agong is a rural area that serves as an "Agro-Themed Park" and is located next to a coconut plantation and paddy fields. Our theme park offers a thrilling and entertaining experience, providing enjoyable opportunities and creating lasting memories for you and your loved ones.

### NASI KANDAR

Nasi kandar is a renowned culinary speciality of Penang, first brought over by Tamil Muslim merchants from India. The meal comprises steamed rice accompanied by various unique curries, side dishes, and gravies.

### PENANG LAKSA

Penang Laksa, commonly known as Asam Laksa, is a distinctive dish from the Malaysian island of Penang. The soup is prepared with mackerel as its primary ingredient. Its notable characteristic is the inclusion of asam or tamarind, which imparts a sour and appealing flavour to the soup.





## **NASI LEMAK**

Nasi lemak, a traditional Malaysian delicacy, is made from aromatic rice cooked in coconut milk with pandan leaves. It is widely eaten and revered as a national delicacy.

## **ROTI CANAI**

Roti canai, often referred to as roti prata, roti chanai, or roti cane, is a type of Indian flatbread that is commonly consumed in many Southeast Asian countries.



## **PASEMBOR**

Pasembur, also known as Pasemboq in Northern Malay, is a Malaysian salad. It combines shredded cucumber, potatoes, bean curd, turnip, bean sprouts, prawn fritters, spicy fried crab, fried squid, or other types of seafood. The salad is topped with a flavourful sauce made from nuts with sweet and spicy notes.

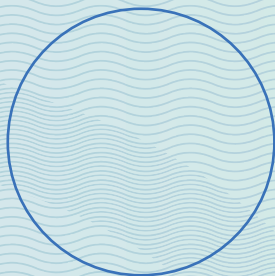
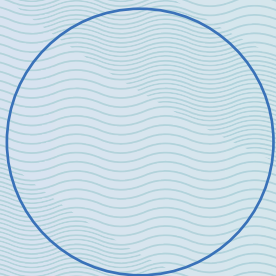
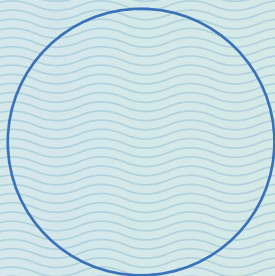
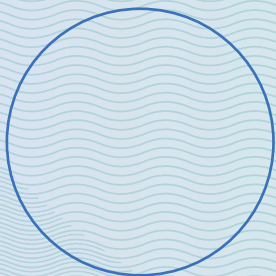
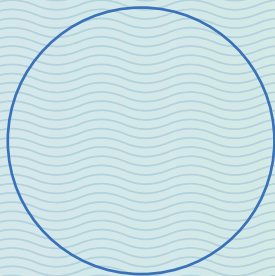
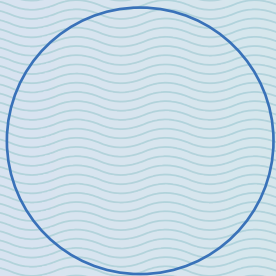
## HOMESTAY PULAU BETONG
